# STOKE ON TRENT RESEARCH SCHOOL

## Course information

### **Early Years Literacy**

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's Guidance Report 'Preparing for Literacy' and associated educational research. It examines 'best practice' in the teaching of communication, language and literacy to children between the ages of three and five. However, it may also be applicable to older pupils who have fallen behind their peers, or younger pupils who are making rapid progress. It is aimed at both literacy coordinators and teachers of early years children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

12<sup>th</sup> April 2019, 24<sup>th</sup> May 2019 and 14<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

### **Key Stages 1 & 2 Literacy**

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Improving Literacy in Key Stages 1 & 2' Guidance Reports and associated educational research. It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of literacy to pupils between the ages of 5 and 11. However, it may also be applicable to older pupils who have fallen behind their peers, or younger pupils who are making rapid progress. The course is aimed at senior leaders, literacy coordinators and teachers of KS1/2 children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

8th March 2019, 18th March 2019 and 10th June 2019

### **Science: Key Stage 3 and 4**

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's forthcoming Science Guidance Report (due to be published in September 2018) and associated educational research. It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of science to pupils between the ages of 11 and 16. The course is aimed at senior leaders, science coordinators and teachers of KS3 and KS4 children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

15<sup>th</sup> January 2019, 11<sup>th</sup> March 2019 and 22<sup>nd</sup> May 2019.

### **Metacognition and Self-Regulated Learning**

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Metacognition and Self-Regulated Learning' Guidance Report and associated educational research. The course explores how pupils best monitor, direct, and review their learning. Furthermore, it examines and highlights metacognitive strategies that get learners to think about their own learning more explicitly, usually by teaching them to set goals, and monitor and evaluate their own academic progress. The course is aimed at senior leaders and teachers from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 4. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

12<sup>th</sup> February 2019, 17<sup>th</sup> May 2019 and 27<sup>th</sup> June 2019.

**'Implementation' Guidance Report for schools receiving ELS funding.**

This half-day event focuses on the recently published Education Endowment Foundation 'Implementation' Guidance Report. The course explores the key research-informed themes which relate to the effective introduction, monitoring and evaluation of school-based interventions.

All schools in the 'Opportunity Area' have access to this short course (as set out in the letter notifying schools of their ELS allocation, schools can use part of their allocation to pay for this training). The fee is £55. There is an expectation that at least one colleague, from all schools in the OA area, will attend one of the sessions.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 1330-1630 on the following dates:

10<sup>th</sup> Oct 2018 and repeated on the 25<sup>th</sup> October 2018.

**Continuing Professional Development on effective 'Transition' practices**

This short course is aimed at those schools who were successful in their bids for Opportunity Area funding ['Transition' projects] and there is an expectation that project leads from each of the successful schools will attend. Schools can elect to fund attendance from their 'Research School Wallet' allocation to cover the course fee (£55).

### **Continuing Professional Development to support successful school clusters on 'transition between KS2 and 3'**

This course is aimed at colleagues who are closely involved in the successful 'Transition' projects (and are in receipt of Opportunity Area funding). There is an expectation that two colleagues involved in the projects will attend the two-day course (a Primary school colleague and the associated Secondary school colleague).

The course will focus on 'best practice', on the research evidence base and will explore effective practice relating to implementation, monitoring and evaluation of school-based projects.

Schools can elect to fund attendance from their 'Research School Wallet' allocation to cover the course fee (£110).

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 1330-1630 on the following dates:

### **Supporting Early Career Teachers – Workforce Development in Stoke on Trent**

The four sessions, each with a distinct focus, will support early career teachers to become increasingly research engaged as part of their regular practice.
