STOKE ON TRENT RESEARCH SCHOOL

Course information

Pupil Premium

This three-day course focuses on Education Endowment Foundation guidance and associated educational research. It examines 'best practice' in supporting children who are eligible for the Pupil Premium. It is aimed at senior leaders/teachers who have responsibility for overseeing Pupil Premium provision in their schools. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

8th October 2018, 22nd January 2019 and 26th March 2019.

Key Stage 2/3 Mathematics – Back to the Evidence

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's Guidance Report and associated educational research. It examines 'best practice' in the teaching of mathematics. It is aimed at both KS2 and KS3 mathematics curriculum leaders and teachers. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

12th October 2018, 11th January 2019 and 29th March 2019.

Early Years Literacy

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's Guidance Report 'Preparing for Literacy' and associated educational research. It examines 'best practice' in the teaching of communication, language and literacy to children between the ages of three and five. However, it may also be applicable to older pupils who have fallen behind their peers, or younger pupils who are making rapid progress. It is aimed at both literacy coordinators and teachers of early years children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

12th February 2019, 13th May 2019 and 5th June 2019.

Key Stage 1 Literacy

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Improving Literacy in Key Stage 1' Guidance Report and associated educational research. It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of literacy to pupils between the ages of 5 and 7. However, it may also be applicable to older pupils who have fallen behind their peers, or younger pupils who are making rapid progress. The course is aimed at senior leaders, literacy coordinators and teachers of KS1 children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

19th November 2018, 14th February 2019 and 12th March 2019.

Key Stage 2 Literacy

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Improving Literacy in Key Stage 2' Guidance Report and associated educational research.

It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of literacy to pupils between the ages of 7 and 11. However, it may also be applicable to older pupils who have fallen behind their peers, or younger pupils who are making rapid progress. The course is aimed at senior leaders, literacy coordinators and teachers of KS2 children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

8th March 2019, 18th March 2019 and 10th June 2019

Key Stage 3 Literacy

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Improving literacy in secondary schools' Guidance Report and associated educational research. It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of literacy to pupils between the ages of 11 and 16 (although there will be a particular focus on KS3). The course is aimed at senior leaders, literacy coordinators and teachers of KS3 and KS4 children.

Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

19th November 2018, 14th February 2019 and 12th March 2019

Supporting the Development of School-based Research Leads

This three-day course focuses on a range of Education Endowment Foundation resources and is designed to support the development of school-based colleagues who are ambitious to explore evidence-informed practice and develop their skills in interpreting/conducting educational research. The course will explore EEF Guidance Reports, toolkits and will examine approaches to the implementation and evaluation of school-based interventions.

Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

10th December 2018, 14th January 2019 and 4th March 2019.

Science: Key Stage 3 and 4

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's forthcoming Science Guidance Report (due to be published in September 2018) and associated educational research. It explores 'best practice' in the teaching of science to pupils between the ages of 11 and 16. The course is aimed at senior leaders, science coordinators and teachers of KS3 and KS4 children. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

15th January 2019, 11th March 2019 and 22nd May 2019.

Metacognition and Self-Regulated Learning

This three-day course focuses on the Education Endowment Foundation's 'Metacognition and Self-Regulated Learning' Guidance Report and associated educational research. The course explores how pupils best monitor, direct, and review their learning. Furthermore, it examines and highlights metacognitive strategies get learners to think about their own learning more explicitly, usually by teaching them to set goals, and monitor and evaluate their own academic progress. The course is aimed at senior leaders and teachers from Key Stage 1 to Key Stage 4. Attendance is expected for each of the three days.

The course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 0930-1530 on the following dates:

12th February 2019, 17th May 2019 and 27th June 2019.

Continuing Professional Development to support high ability Pupil Premium pupils focusing on 'Philosophy for Children' (P4C) based on EEF research findings

Within S-o-T and Staffordshire, there is an increasing emphasis on both P4C and dialogic teaching. Many schools are focussing on this as part of their transition work. This course will explore the evidence base to support schools in the process of making substantive plans for their own settings.

The course is aimed at senior leaders and teachers who are closely involved in supporting high ability children (in receipt of Pupil Premium funding).

This free course takes place at the Bridge Centre. 1330-1630 on the following dates:

'Specialist Leaders of Education' (SLEs) Engaging with the evidence base [cross-phase]

Many SLEs have not yet had a supported opportunity to consider the value of the EEF resources in relation to their work. The EEF guidance materials provide an essential framework to support SLEs in offering evidence informed advice to the schools and settings that they work with. These sessions build on the English Maths and Science Continuing Professional Development materials and orientate them towards the work of SLEs, enabling SLEs to have a reference point beyond their own experiences.

The fee associated with the course is £90 (this covers attendance at all three sessions) and takes place at the Bridge Centre. 1330-1630 on the following dates:

25th January 2019, 22nd March 2019 and 3rd May 2019.
